The Book that is Inspired, Unique, and Amazing!

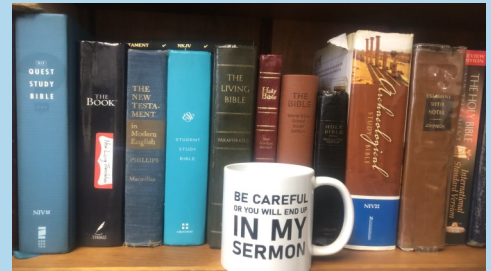

Our older granddaughter, who is not quite two, loves her baby doll ... to death! She always has it with her, will hug and kiss it tenderly—but then quite suddenly drop it or shove it into the microwave of her play kitchen. We shake our heads and jokingly remark that it'll be a while before she's ready for a real baby.

Christians can be like that as well with their Bibles, often treating their phones with more reverence, care, and time than they do the Word. In our affluent, materialistic, and hedonistic culture, with more disposable income and leisure time than any other period in history, we each likely have multiple copies of God's Word—even on our phones. Yet, what is our attitude towards them? Are they cherished by daily study and reflection ... or are they collecting dust on a nightstand? A video of Chinese Christians weeping while receiving their own Bibles, illegal to possess in their country, stands as a stark contrast to most Americans today.

Since the Scriptures are *"living and active,"* they should be treated as the inspired, unique, and amazing pages that *"complete"* the *"man of God"* for *"every good work"* (2 Timothy 3:16-17). As it *"discern[s] the thoughts and intentions of the heart,"* the Bible is a two-way communication tool, accompanied by prayer, between our Creator and man who is made in His image (Hebrews 4:12-13).

Yet, when we neglect the study of it or prayer to Him in faith, aren't we a lot like a fickle toddler desperate for her doll one minute and then trampling it the next? So many feel adrift in our world today. What a difference it could make for them to know that God loves them and has given guidance for them to live their lives!

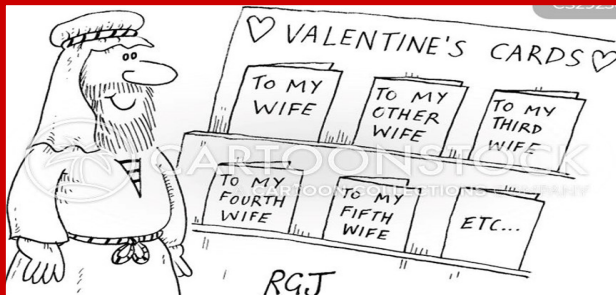


