Whose House is It?

When I brought Angie to the North Country to bury ashes of my first wife and her father, we pulled into the driveway of the house where I had raised my kids for twenty-three years. Memories washed over me as I had remodeled every inch of the place, added onto the house and garage, and landscaped. Angie, however, was uncomfortable lingering—and rightly so—as I had sold the house before moving to West Virginia. It was no longer mine.

Jerusalem was the city in which the LORD had promised to dwell even before Joshua led God’s people into the Promised Land as God travelled with them, enthroned between the cherubim upon the mercy seat on the ark of the covenant. After David moved the ark and tabernacle there, Solomon built the temple, placing the ark in the Holy of Holies, and *“the priests could not stand to minister because of the cloud, for the glory of the LORD filled the **house of the LORD**”* (1 Kings 8:11).

After the Word became flesh, He was brought into where God dwelt with man to *“present him to the Lord”* (Luke 2). Twelve years later, Jesus’ earthly parents searched for Jesus three days until they found Him in the temple teaching the teachers. His response was *“Did you not know that I must be in **my Father’s house**?”* So, when the adult Jesus saw money-changers and those selling livestock and birds, He made a whip and *“drove them all out of the temple,”* pouring out coins, overturning tables, and saying, *“Do not make **my Father’s house** a house of trade”* (John 2:13-22).

And so, when the Jews—squatters essentially—asked Jesus to produce the deed, the authority to do *“these things,”* He responded, *“Destroy this temple (meaning His body), and in three days I will raise it up.”* He didn’t say His Father would ... but overcoming death as the heir (Matthew 28:18), it was **the Son’s house** and so He would do it!

Are not the bodies of His people God’s temple (1 Corinthians 3:16-17) where He resides (Ephesians 3:17) today?
