That's Your Interpretation!

A month and a half ago, I braced myself when my phone rang because a friend had given me advanced notice that a young woman I had known since she was born had fallen into homosexuality and wanted to tell me herself about it. She didn't know that I knew already, and it gave me several days to pray and ready how I would respond to one who had gone to church her whole life. When I brought up the many Scriptures that spoke against her decision, she told me, "I've come to interpret them differently."

Could she? If men are at liberty to make God's Word mean whatever they want it to, is there any such thing as truth? Is truth relative and each decides what it is?

She had been outwitted by the same scheme of Satan (2 Corinthians 2:11) that many do who want to justify sin. Rather than accepting that we are made in God's image (Genesis 1:27) and that it is our job to submit to His authority for our lives (Hebrews 12:9), we set ourselves up as gods and strive to bend the sovereign Creator's will to ours—all the while deceiving ourselves that we are following Him.

That is our role after all and the difficulty of our situation. But even the second person of the Godhead, who did not nor ever needed to submit to anyone, while He was in the flesh and made like us in every way, "*learned obedience through what he suffered*" (Hebrews 5:8). Not wanting to submit, we justify our disobedience by dismissing God's truth by saying, "That's your interpretation!"

But is it? Since we believe "*that no prophecy of Scripture comes from someone's own interpretation. For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit*" (2 Peter 1:20-21), our job is then to discover what God has revealed to us. Truth, then, can never be placed on the buffet of man's opinions to accept or reject based on whim or personal preference.
