The Lovely and Delicately Bred I Will Destroy

Those who study generational theory have seen a major world reset coming every 80 to 90 years throughout history or about every four generations (20 to 25 years each). Our last reset was “the greatest generation” returning from WWII and rebuilding our world—and the end of that conflict was 80 years ago this year. From a reset, there is great cultural and spiritual decline that brings on the next ... and most would say, as they look out upon the world, that we are nearing that point once again.

How could we not be? How long can the darkness and immorality continue to increase before we reach a breaking point? So rapidly it is plummeting that ‘this is not the world I remember’ is said by many of those who are younger and younger. Thus, it must have been in Jeremiah’s day on the eve of the Babylonian captivity when God’s people had plunged into sin and idolatry and “*refused to repent.*”

In speaking of the great reset that was about to befall them, God predicts chilling words in Jeremiah 6:2, “*The lovely and delicately bred I will destroy, the daughter of Zion.*” It was those who had great wealth, influence, and leisure time who would feel the greatest impact of the reset, and 2 Kings 25:9-12 records, “*And he burned the house of the LORD and the king’s house and all the houses of Jerusalem; every great house he burned down,*” but he “*left some of the poorest of the land.*”

Why is that chilling? Because we live in an era when even the poorest among us, thanks especially to advancements in medicine and technology, have more wealth, influence, and leisure time than any other. We are all ‘*the lovely and delicately bred*’ and will feel the impact of the reset hard—whenever and however it eventually comes.

God has always preserved a remnant of His church, and so it is up to His faithful today, who may not be here to rebuild 70 years after captivity, to “*speak the truth in love*” to the next greatest generation.

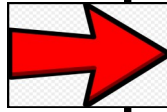
