

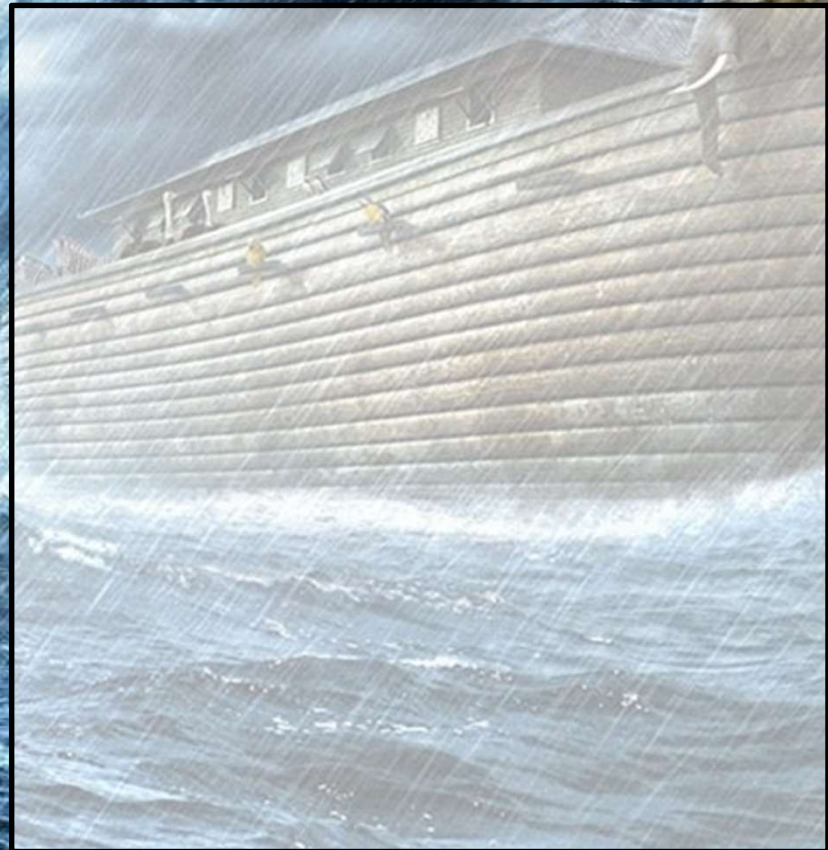

- God hates wickedness and evil



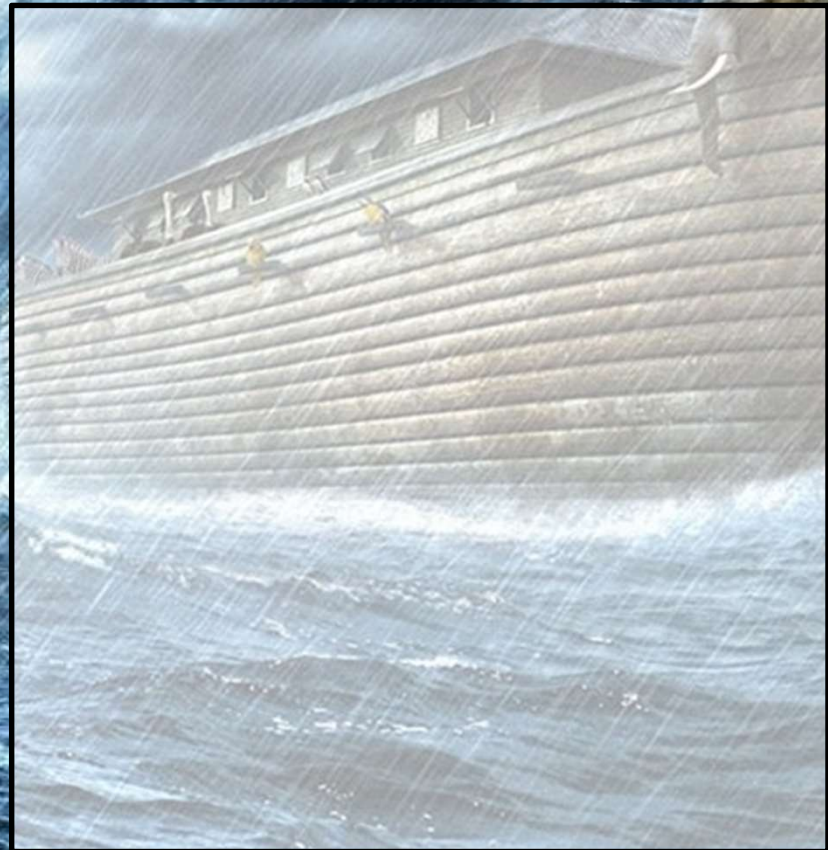
God hates wickedness and evil

- **Genesis 6:5-7** – God was going to destroy everything due to the evil and wickedness of man
- **Genesis 6:12-13** – Even after recognizing Noah, he still destroyed evil from the earth
- **Genesis 6:17** – Destroyed by means of the flood

- God's judgements and promises are true



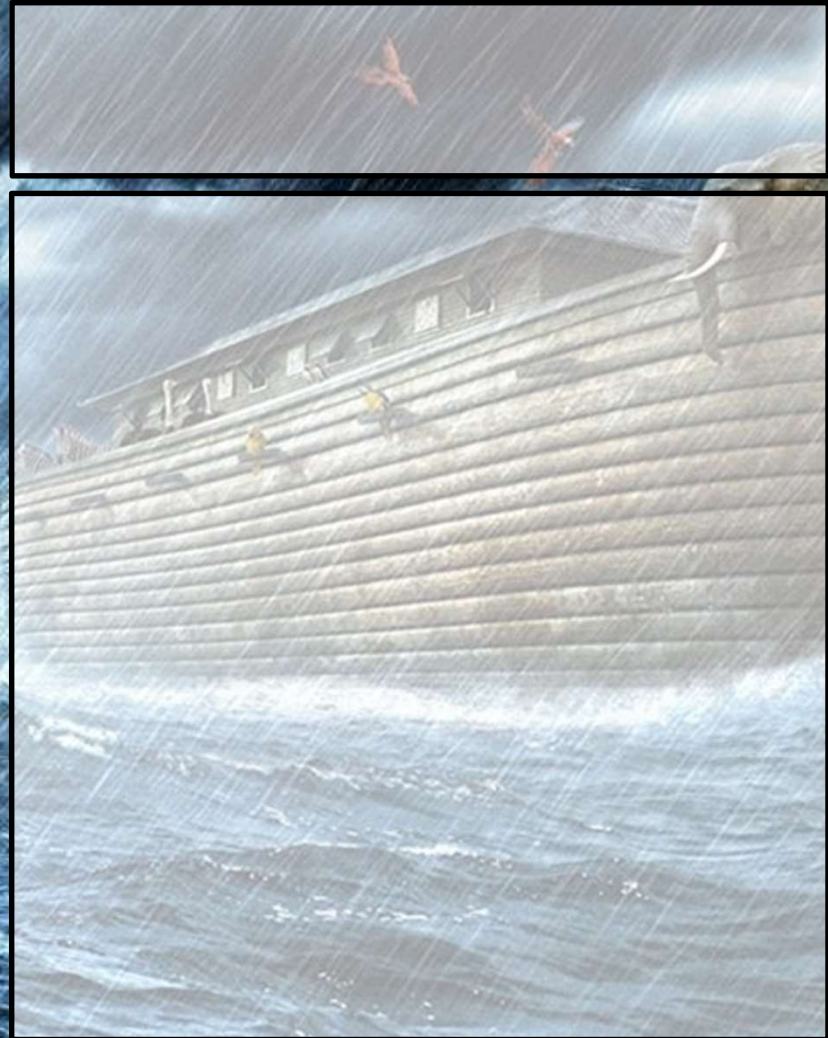
God's judgements and promises are true

- **Genesis 6:11-13, 17** – God said he would destroy the earth with flood waters
- **Genesis 7:10-12** – God destroyed the earth with flood waters
- **Genesis 6:18-21** – God promised to protect those in the ark
- **Genesis 8:13-21** – Those in the ark were protected and survived the flood

Principles in the story of Noah

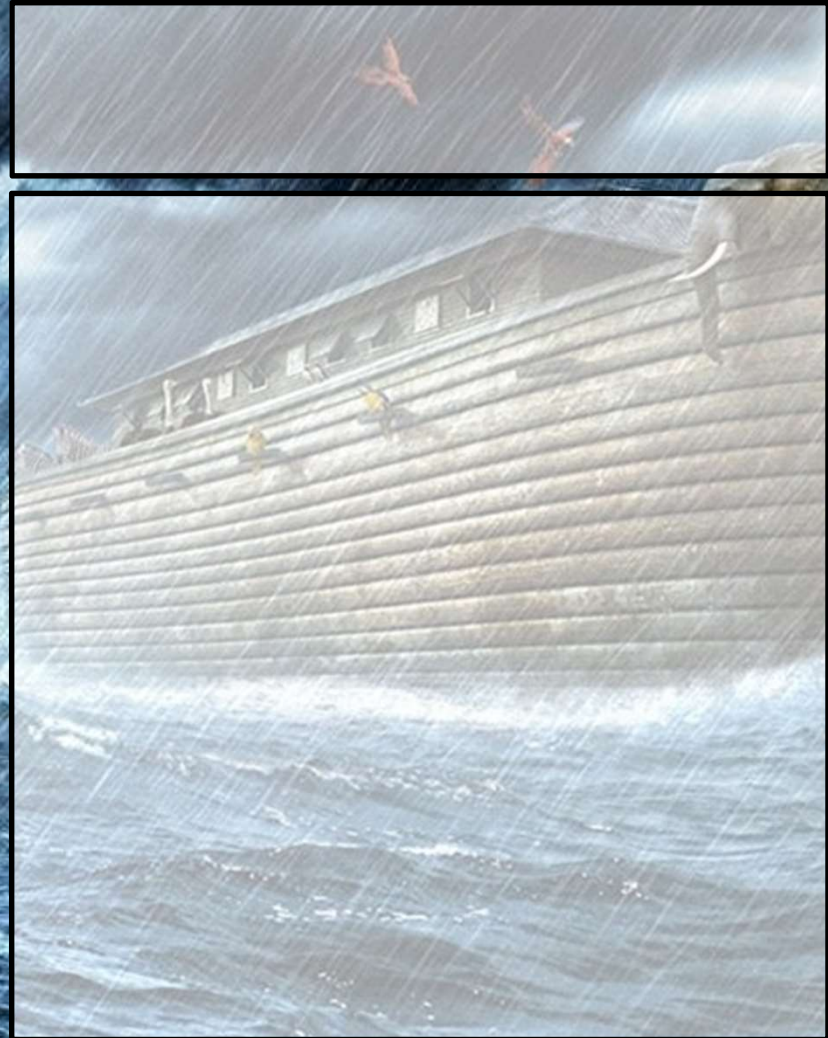
God delivers the godly and destroys the ungodly

- **Genesis 6:8** – Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord
 - **Genesis 6:9** – Noah was a just man, perfect in his generation and walked with God
 - **Genesis 7:1** – Noah was righteous before God in that generation
- **Genesis 6:17-18** – God said he will destroy the earth and make a covenant with Noah
- **Genesis 7:20-23** – Only Noah and those with him remained alive

- Salvation is obtained through obedience



Salvation is obtained through obedience

- Noah did what God had commanded him

- **Genesis 6:22**

- **Genesis 7:1-9**

- **Genesis 7:16**

What if Noah did not do as he was commanded?

- Built the ark as he was commanded
- Brought animals as he was commanded
- Entered the ark as he was commanded

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New Testament

- God hates wickedness and evil

God hates wickedness and evil

- **1 Thessalonians 5:22** – Abstain from evil
- **Romans 12:9** – Abhor what is evil
- **Romans 5:6-9** – Jesus died giving us the opportunity to be saved from the wrath of God, due to His hatred of sin
 - **Hebrews 10:4** – The blood of bulls and goats could not take away sin

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God's judgements and promises are true

- **Hebrews 9:27** – Man dies and then the judgement
- **Matthew 25:31-34, 41** – Judgement will occur
- **2 Corinthians 5:10** – Judged based on the things done in the body
- **2 Peter 3:9-10** – He wants all to come to repentance, but eventually the day of the lord will come

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- **2 Peter 2:4-9** – God delivers those who are righteous and destroys those who are ungodly
 - Angels who sinned were cast down to hell
 - Noah, one of eight, was saved but the ungodly were destroyed
 - Lot was saved but Sodom and Gomorrah were destroyed

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- **Hebrews 11:6-7** – God rewards those who diligently seek and obey Him
 - Noah, knowing the flood was coming, obeyed God and saved his household
- **Romans 6:16-17** – We are slaves to what we obey (sin or righteousness)
- **Hebrews 3:18** – Those who did not obey did not enter His rest

Principles in the story of Noah

- **Application for us...**
 - If God hates wickedness and evil...
 - We will still away from it
 - If God's judgements and promises are true...
 - We will trust Him
 - If God delivers the godly and destroys the ungodly...
 - We are going to live godly
 - If salvation is through obedience...
 - We will obey Him

1 Peter 3:18-22


¹⁸ For Christ also suffered once for sins, the just for the unjust, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive by the Spirit, ¹⁹ by whom also He went and preached to the spirits in prison, ²⁰ who formerly were disobedient, when once the Divine longsuffering waited in the days of Noah, while *the* ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight souls, were saved through water. ²¹ There is also an antitype which now saves us—baptism (not the removal of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God), through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²² who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, angels and authorities and powers having been made subject to Him.

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
