I. MONEY – MATERIAL POSSESSIONS.

- A. "Money makes a good servant, but a poor master."
- B. Money makes an even worse god. 1 Tim. 6:9, 10
- C. What we need most, money can't buy.

II. EDUCATION.

- A. Some have made a religion our learning.
- B. Much of higher education is aimed at the exaltation of learning at the expense of faith.
- C. It is argued that education without God can make a better world. 1 Tim. 6:20

III. PLEASURE.

- A. The cult of pleasure is a multi-billion-dollar business.
- B. The Bible warns that those that live this way are dead even while they live. 1 Tim. 5:6
- C. If we recklessly pursue the satisfaction of our own desires we are sacrificing ourselves at the deadly shrine of a counterfeit god.
