It *Scripturally* Answers The *Question*

Matthew 7:21

“Not everyone who says to Me, ‘Lord, Lord,’ will enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father who is in heaven will enter.”



What – Something is required.

Must – Not a matter of opinion.

I - Individual responsibility.

Do – Not think, feel or believe – Action!

To Be Saved – Action done by another.



A. Lessons To Learn:

- 1) The Mosaic Law Was Still In Effect (Colossians 2:14)
- 2) He Was Instructed To “*Follow Me*”
 - Yet he “*went away sorrowful*”
- 3) Though Sincere He Was Unwilling To Simply Obey

Question: “What Shall We Do?”

Answer: “Repent and Be Baptized”

- 1) Why Is Belief Left Out?
- 2) “repent **AND** ... be baptized...”
- 3) Salvation Requires More Than Faith & A Changed Heart.

2) *Acts 2:14-38*



Question: “What Do You Want Me To Do?”

Answer: “Arise and Be Baptized”

- 1) Was Saul/Paul Saved Upon Belief?
- 2) Upon Repentance? (9:9,11)
- 3) Upon His Changed Heart? (9:6; 22:13-15)
- 4) Upon His “I Think So...?” (26:9-11)

3) *Acts 9:1-18*



Question: "What Must I Do To Be Saved?"

Answer: "Believe" "Were Baptized"

Doesn't This Contradict?

- 1) Who Is The Teacher?
- 2) Was The Jailor A Jew? (v. 32; Rom. 10:17)
- 3) Was Baptism Delayed? (v. 33)

4) Acts 16:25-33 

Did God Give 3 Different Answers?

- 1) The Jailor Was An Unbeliever
- 2) Acts 2 Hearers Were Believers
- 3) Saul Believed And Was Penitent
