

What makes it a “throne of grace”?

Jesus is there!

“we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God” (Heb. 4:14)

⁹ Now when He had spoken these things, while they watched, He was taken up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight.¹⁰ And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel,¹¹ who also said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven.” (Acts 1:9-11)



What makes it a “throne of grace”?

Jesus is sympathetic!

“we do not have a high priest who is unable to **sympathize** with our weaknesses” (Heb. 4:15)

¹⁴ Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, He Himself likewise shared in the same, ...

¹⁷ Therefore, in all things He had to be made like His brethren, that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. (Heb. 2:14,17)
