## Objective

We often look at the Old Testament & New Testament almost as different narratives; however, the ministry of Christ, His death and resurrection are the summit of God's great plan conceived before Genesis 1:1 with promises made to mankind from Genesis 3 to Abraham to the prophets. Even within this broader narrative, there are mini sagas like Isaiah that typologically show us much about our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ – His mission, His mindset, His identity – as well as how God interacts with His covenant people both historically and today. Likewise, there are many historical facts & events surrounding and contained within Isaiah that show us the divine origins of our faith and the power/reality/involvement of our God.

By the end of this course, the student should:

1. Have a solid, high-level understanding of the Book of Isaiah, its context in history and its place in the broader narrative of scripture.
2. Have a deeper understanding of Jesus Christ – His mission, mindset, and identity.
3. Have a deeper understanding of God's workings with His covenant people both historically and today
4. Have a deeper faith rooted in the surety of our God, His power and His presence.
