When our country falls and it will if we do not change immediately – the reasons will lie in families faltering – causing communities to falter – causing schools to falter – and the blame will be right back on the ones who say they are soldiers of Christ – just as the blame was on those who claimed to be the children of God that caused the destruction of Jerusalem. ## **Focus on** **Evangelism**

### **“Him we Preach”**

The apostle Paul said this in Col. 1:28-29, “Him we preach, warning every man and teaching every man in all wisdom, that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus. To this end I also labor, striving according to His working which works in me mightily.”

In this article I want to focus on the thought of “preaching Him, preaching Jesus” or “Him we preach” as Paul said above. When we are involved in the work of personal evangelism—if we understand our labor at hand...we are preaching Jesus.

I have always been impressed with the account of Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch in Acts 8:26-40. You will remember that Philip, the evangelist, was instructed to meet

up with this eunuch as he returned home from worshipping in Jerusalem. Philip, as he came near to the eunuchs’ chariot, heard the eunuch reading from Isaiah and Philip asked him, “Do you understand what you are reading?” and the eunuch said, “How can I, unless someone guides me.?” (v.30-31)

Then the eunuch asked Philip to join him in his chariot and then this famous Bible study begins! As the study begins they read Isaiah 53:7-8 again and the eunuch asked Philip a question about the reading...he said, “I ask you, of whom does the prophet say this, of himself or of some other man?” And Philip said, “**that’s a great question!**” (sorry, that’s what I would have said), actually Acts 8:35 tells us that, “Philip opened his mouth, and beginning at this scripture, preached Jesus to him.” We know that the eunuch obeys the gospel of Christ and goes on his way rejoicing because his sins had been forgiven!

But what I want you to notice is that even though this was a Bible study with only Philip and the eunuch, a one on one study...the passage says Philip preached Jesus to him.

What’s my point? We usually think of preaching being a man in the pulpit, don’t we? That of course is true, but when we are involved in

teaching our family and friends, we are to be "preaching Jesus" to them.

We are told again in Acts 8:1, that after..."a great persecution arose against the church which was at Jerusalem," that the Christians, except the apostles, "were scattered throughout the region." Now what did these Christians do? (v.4) says, "those who were scattered, went everywhere preaching the word." This preaching wasn't done in a pulpit, but when they met people as they were scattered!

We need to learn from their example—they preached Jesus. We need to be preaching Him..."warning every man and teaching every man in all wisdom, that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus." (Col. 1:28) If only we had Paul's attitude..."necessity is laid upon me, yes, woe is me, if I do not preach the gospel!" (1 Cor. 9:16b)
