2 Chronicles 29-31

■ Principles for Restoration:

1. Restoration begins with going back to the source, the Bible.
2. Restoration is sustained when I desire to do *only* God's will.
3. Restoration is not satisfied with *good enough* or *close enough*.
4. Restoration is not complete until all hindrances and idols are removed.

■ Some Final Observations:

- Restoration not reformation.
2 Timothy 3:16-17; 2 Peter 3:1
- To restore is to go back to the original.
(John 16:13; Jeremiah 6:16)
- Restoration is possible because God did not leave us without the truth **(John 8:32)**.
- The only right decision to make when we are on the wrong path is to go back to the right path.
