# DEUTERONOMY

- Moses begins the book by giving the events leading up to his reciting of the law, 1:1-5
- Moses recounts the history of Israel's time at Horeb (Sinai) and God's command to leave from there as well as Moses' need for help in judging the people, 1:6-18



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- Next Moses reminds Israel of their failure to enter the land at God's command (Num. 13), 1:19-33
- God's judgment was that the people return to the wilderness, however they further rebelled by trying to enter the land, 1:34-46



# DEUTERONOMY

## Applications

- Ch 1: Following God's commands brings success, rebellion brings punishment

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- After the wandering was complete God commanded Israel to travel through the land of Edom, 2:1-7
- They were to not antagonize Edom because their land was a gift from God.



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- Next God commanded Israel to pass through the land of Moab, 2:8-15
- Moab's land was also an inheritance from God, and they were to respect that as they passed through.



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- Israel passed through the land of Ammon, and God again warned they respect that Ammon's land was their inheritance from Him, 2:16-25
- Edom, Moab, and Ammon were all related to Israel, God is illustrating that He takes care of all nations.



# DEUTERONOMY

- Next Moses recounts how God had provided them victory over their enemies.
- Sihon king of Hesbon was defeated by God giving Israel land as an inheritance, 2:26-37



# DEUTERONOMY

## Applications

- Ch 1: Following God's commands brings success, rebellion brings punishment
- Ch 2: God is faithful to fulfill His promises



# DEUTERONOMY

- God gave Israel victory over Og king of Bashan providing them even more land, 3:1-11
- After their victories their newly conquered land was allotted to Reuben, Gad, and half of the tribe of Manasseh, 3:12-17



# DEUTERONOMY

- God commanded Reuben, Gad, and Manasseh that they had to help the rest of Israel take the rest of the land, 3:18-22
- After this Moses tells of his request to enter the land even though he was guilty of sin (Num. 20:9-11). God denied his request, 3:23-29
