

# Deuteronomy

## Lesson 4 Deuteronomy 10-12

Moses begins the chapter 10 with a recounting of the events surrounding the creation of the second tablets of stone. This leads to a discussion of what God's requirements were for His people under His covenant. They were to bear the mark of the covenant, not in their flesh only, but in their hearts. Chapter 11 lays forth the rewards for obedience to the covenant, something their fathers had not enjoyed due to their repeated disobedience. Chapter 12 focuses on the worship of God by the people after they enter the land. Not only are they given commands about removing the idols of the land, but of where to worship the LORD, how to slaughter their animals, but they are also reminded to care for the Levites. We learn from these chapters not only that God's covenant carries blessing, but also that the manner in which His people keep it is vitally important.
