# DEUTERONOMY

- Moving from the need for fear of God, Moses now points out the lesson of their history with God, 11:1-7
- Israel's obedience would bring them reward from God, not as payment but a gift from God, 11:8-12



# DEUTERONOMY

- Obedience would bring plentiful growth in the land from God, 11:13-17
- Moses concludes this portion by calling for the people to pay close attention to their obedience to God, 11:18-25



# DEUTERONOMY

- Moses follows his conclusion by placing the blessings and curses before the people to remind them of what obedience or disobedience would lead to, 11:26-32



# DEUTERONOMY

# DEUTERONOMY

- God commanded the people to destroy all of the ways that the people of the land worshiped, 12:1-7
- When the people cross over they were not to do what was right in their own eyes, but what is pleasing to the LORD, 12:8-12



# DEUTERONOMY

- The people were not to offer sacrifices anywhere except the place God commanded, 12:13-14
- The people are given instruction for slaughtering animals, where they could eat, and their obligations to the Levite, 12:15-19



# DEUTERONOMY

- God gives further commands regarding food and sacrifices for after the people had taken the land, 12:20-27
- Israel is called to carefully listen to God's commands that they would not be cast from the land like the nations, 12:28-32
