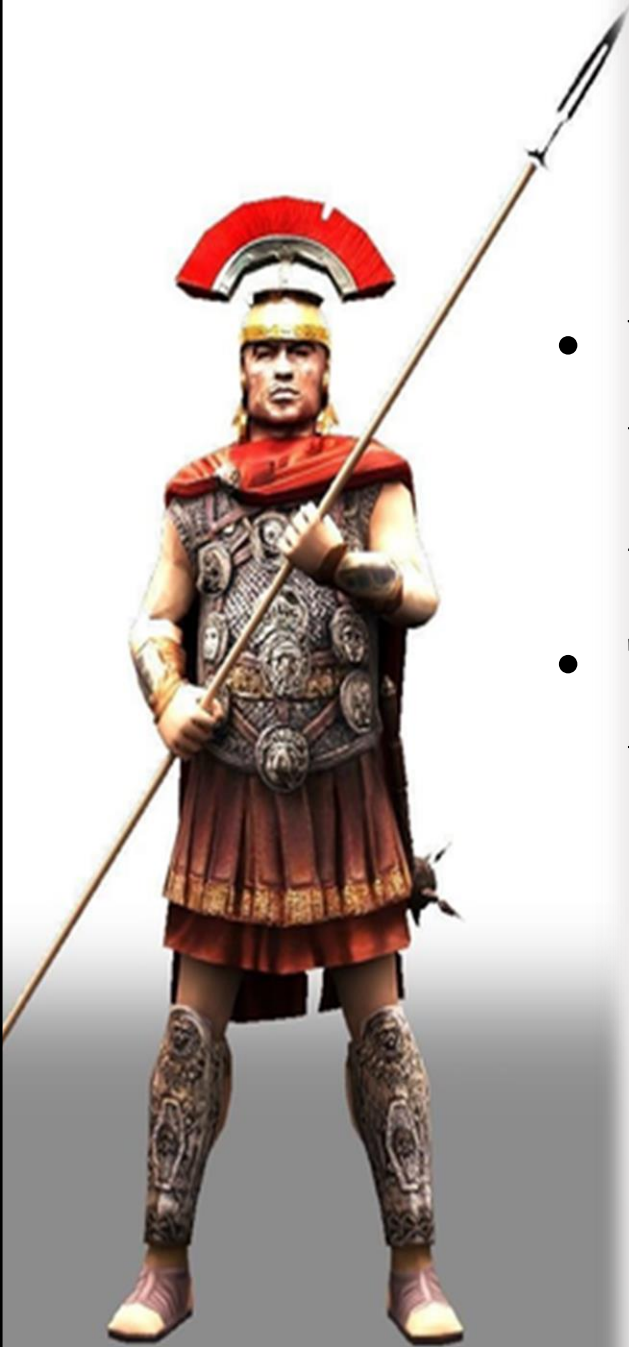




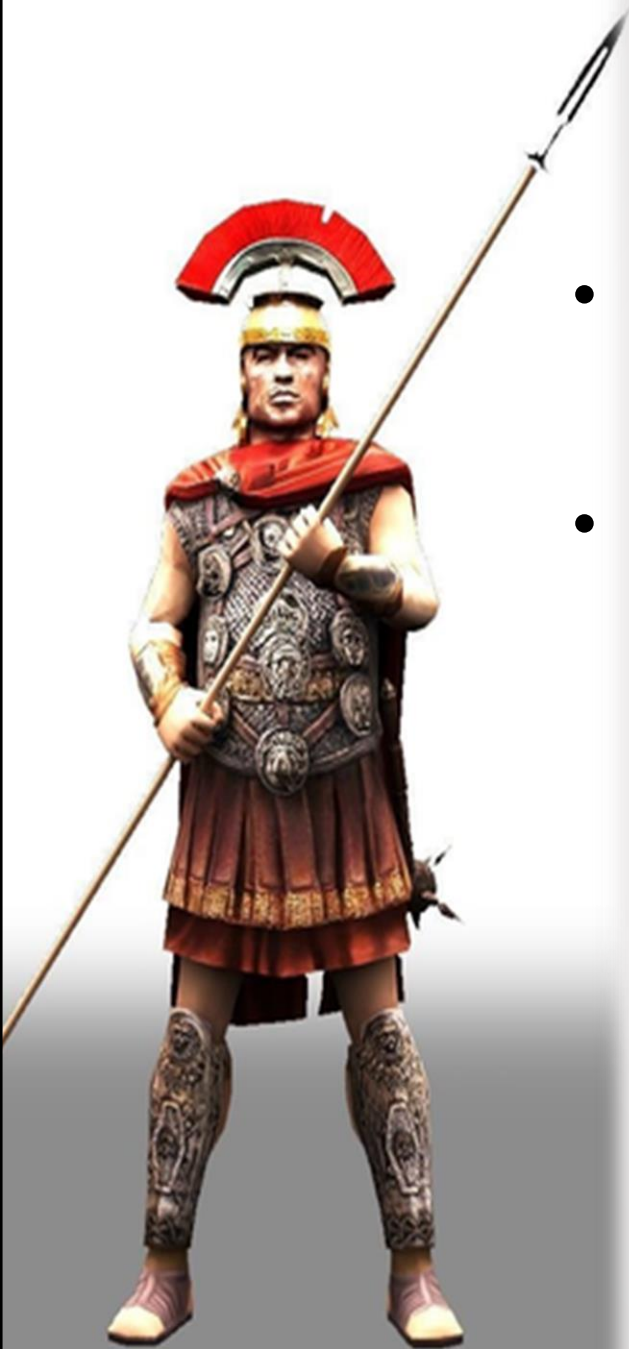

The Centurion at the Crucifixion



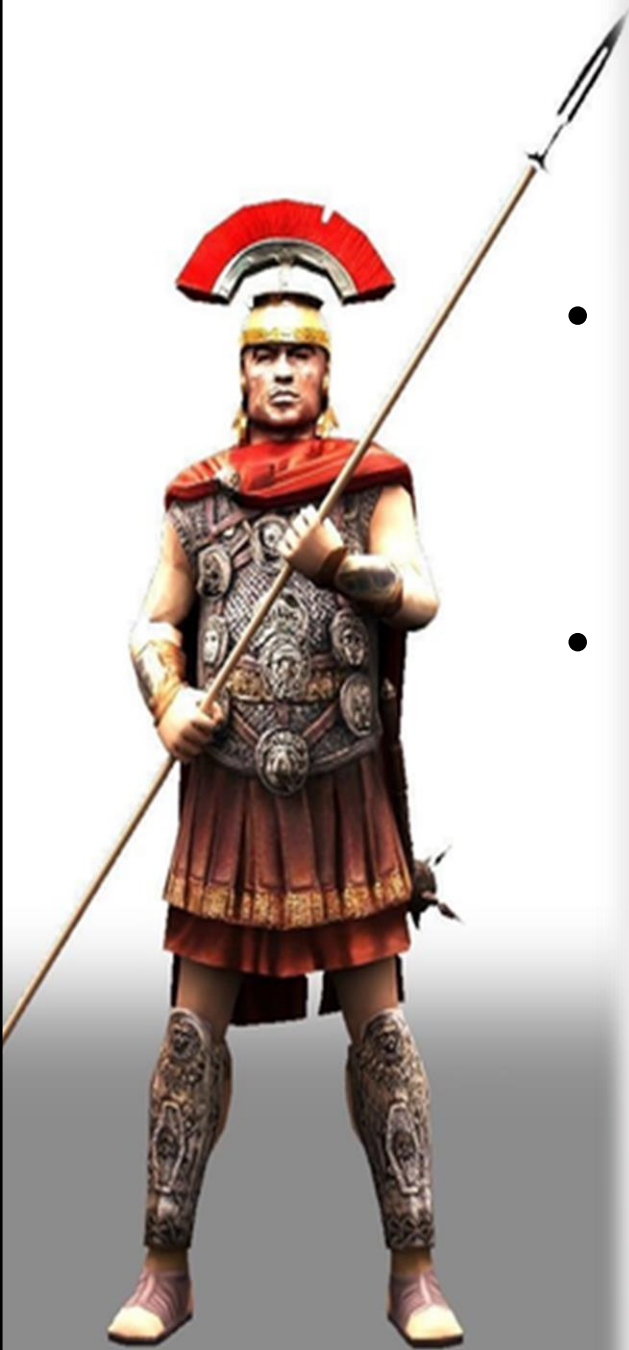
- While overseeing this event in the line of duty, there were problems with his behavior – Mk. 15:16-20; Jn. 20:25; Mk. 15:24; Lk. 23:36-37
- This is not the end of his story, seeing that after witnessing the events of Jesus' death...
 - He glorified God and confessed Jesus to be a **righteous man** – Lk. 23:45-47
 - He confessed Jesus to be **the Son of God** – Mk. 15:37-39; 1:1; 14:61-64

How do you compare?



- Sadly, despite his profession, we are left with **uncertainty** concerning his spiritual fate!
- **We** are left standing next to him at the foot of the cross, knowing all that this man knew, and pondering our next step.
 - Will your day end in *uncertainty*, with no real commitment to Jesus, THE SON OF GOD?
 - Will your choice today and what follows leave others to wonder “what if?”
 - To end your life in *spiritual uncertainty* is *most certainly* to end your life with no hope of heaven and the expectation of condemnation!
