

Attitude Toward Sin

Rom 3:21-24

21 But now apart from the Law the righteousness of God has been manifested, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, 22 even the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all those who believe; for there is no distinction; 23 **for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,**

Isa 59:1-2

Behold, the Lord's hand is not so short
That it cannot save;
Nor is His ear so dull
That it cannot hear.

2 But your **iniquities have made a separation between you and your God**, And your sins have hidden His face from you so that He does not hear.

Acts 13:21-23

Ps 51:1-4

(A psalm of David when Nathan the prophet came to him after he had sinned with Bathsheba)

1 Be gracious to me, O God, according to Your lovingkindness; According to the greatness of Your compassion blot out my transgressions.

2 Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity
And cleanse me from my sin.

**3 For I know my transgressions,
And my sin is ever before me.**

4 Against You, You only, I have sinned
And done what is evil in Your sight,
So that You are justified when You speak
And blameless when You judge.

Ps 51:14-17 (Continued)

14 Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, the God of my salvation;

Then my tongue will joyfully sing of Your righteousness.

15 O Lord, open my lips,

That my mouth may declare Your praise.

16 For You do not delight in sacrifice, otherwise I would give it;

You are not pleased with burnt offering.

17 The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit;

A broken and a contrite heart, O God, You will not despise.

Ps 32:1-5

1 How blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven,

Through my groaning all day long.

4 For day and night Your hand was heavy upon me;

There is no health in my bones because of my sin.

Ps 32:1-22

6 I am bent over and greatly bowed down;

The Lord's Supper

The Lord's Supper

Lev 26:40-46

40 **'If** they confess their iniquity and the iniquity of their forefathers, in their unfaithfulness which they committed against Me, and also in their acting with hostility against Me — 41 I also was acting with hostility against them, to bring them into the land of their enemies — or **if their uncircumcised heart becomes humbled so that they then make amends for their iniquity,** 42 **then** I will remember My covenant with Jacob, and I will remember also My covenant with Isaac, and My covenant with Abraham as well, and I will remember the land

The Lord's Supper

1 Cor 11:23-26

23 For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus in the night in which He was betrayed took bread; 24 and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, "This is My body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of Me."

25 In the same way He took the cup also after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood; do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

26 For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

The Lord's Supper

We often read these verses as we partake of communion every week. In this we remember what the Lord has done for us.

However, the Lord's Supper consists of two parts.

The Lord's Supper

- The first part is what we **remember what the Lord has done for us.**
- The second part is a equally important, but often overlooked.
We **remember what we have done for the Lord.**

The Lord's Supper

Without us properly doing the second part of the Lord's Supper, **we can change the Lord's sacrifice on the cross to something completely useless.**

It changes the Lord's supper to **nothing more than a warm fuzzy feeling**, and no benefit to us.

The Lord's Supper (2nd Part)

1 Cor 11:27-32

27 Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner, shall be guilty of the body and the blood of the Lord. 28 **But a man must examine himself, and in so doing he is to eat of the bread and drink of the cup.** 29 **For he who eats and drinks, eats and drinks judgment to himself if he does not judge the body rightly.** 30 For this reason many among you are weak and sick, and a number sleep. 31 **But if** we judged ourselves rightly, we would not be judged. 32 But when we are judged, we are disciplined by the Lord so that we will not be condemned along with the world.

Observe the wording in 1 Cor 11:28-29

28 But a man **must examine himself**, and in so doing he is to eat of the bread and drink of the cup.

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Why?

Heb 10:26-31

26 For if we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, 27 but a terrifying expectation of judgment and THE FURY OF A FIRE WHICH WILL CONSUME THE ADVERSARIES. 28 Anyone who has set aside the Law of Moses dies without mercy on the testimony of two or three witnesses. 29 How much severer punishment do you think he will deserve who has trampled under foot the Son of God, and has regarded as unclean the blood of the covenant by which he was sanctified, and has insulted the Spirit of grace? 30 For we know Him who said, "VENGEANCE IS MINE, I WILL REPAY." And again, "THE LORD WILL JUDGE HIS PEOPLE." 31 It is a terrifying thing to fall into the hands of the living God.

The question to ask is

“What is my attitude toward my sin”?

❖ Ps 32:17-18

17 For I am ready to fall,

And my sorrow is continually before me.

I am full of anxiety because of my sin.

The question to ask is

❖ Is my attitude toward sin like Peter’s?

❖ **Luke 22:61-62**

61 The Lord turned and looked at Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how He had told him, "Before a rooster crows today, you will deny Me three times." 62 **And he went out and wept bitterly.**

The question to ask is

“What is my attitude toward my sin”?

- ❖ Is my attitude toward sin like the Roman Catholic confessional?
 - ❖ I have confessed my sins, the Lord’s Supper memorial reminds me that I am good to go for another week.

2 Thess 1:6-11

6 For after all it is only just for God to repay with affliction those who afflict you, 7 and to give relief to you who are afflicted and to us as well when the Lord Jesus will be revealed from heaven with His mighty angels in flaming fire, 8 dealing out retribution to those who do not know God and to those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. 9 These will pay the penalty of eternal destruction, away from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power, 10 when He comes to be glorified in His saints on that day, and to be marveled at among all who have believed — for our testimony to you was believed.

Rom 1:16-17

16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. 17 For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, **"BUT THE RIGHTEOUS man SHALL LIVE BY FAITH."**
