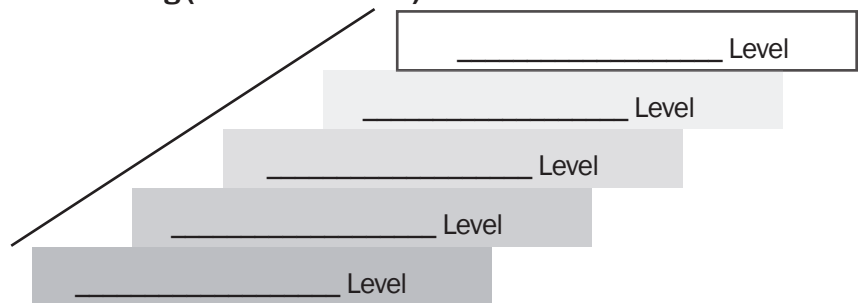

- D) Jesus desired disciples who not only had ears to hear (Matthew 13:9) but hearts to understand (v. 36) and He made sure they understood (v. 51).
