

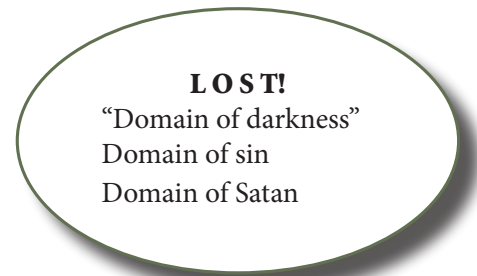
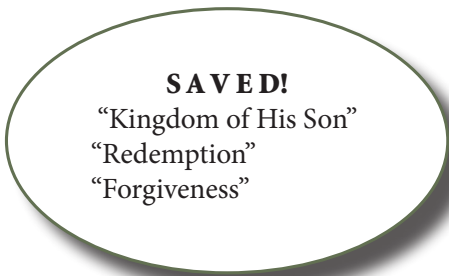


Colossians 1:13-14

A. It is essential to understand what is not meant. This is not “saved and certain” in the sense that one is saved and certain never to be lost (“Once saved, always saved”). That popular teaching of Protestantism is not upheld by Scripture (Heb.3:12-14; 6:4-6).

B. It is essential to understand what is meant. One can know he is “saved and certain” because his/her faith rests upon the terms of the gospel as revealed in Scripture. Hence, “saved” and “certain” about it. I wish it could be said that it doesn’t matter—that you can be saved by embracing whatever teaching you like. However, God has revealed His will and you either obey or refuse.
