to help others

John 10:30-39

- Quotes Psalm 82:6, “I said, ‘You are gods, sons of the Most High, all of you;’”
- “If he called them gods to whom the word of God came — and Scripture cannot be broken”
- Others need to know/see how we view/handle scripture. Luke 10:25-26 - We need to ask “how do you read it?” This encourages them to “rightly divide” God’s word as well. It helps both parties in study.

to correct others

Mark 11:15-19

- It can be difficult to correct others. It's difficult for both parties.

- This is why we go to the word when correcting. Not to simply say, “You're wrong!”, but to instruct. This was an opportunity for Jesus to help by teaching.

- Using the word shows our brother/sister we're more concerned about God's standard rather than our own. This also helps a person “keep their cool”. It's not about what I say/think, but more importantly what God is teaching you.

when questioning things

Mark 7:1-13

- First ask: am I genuinely concerned/searching and ready for an answer? Acts 17:10-12; 16-21.
- Do I still accept God’s authority? Jesus did.
- Remember, we live our lives according to what God said and not what we assume (1 Samuel 15:22-23).

Matthew 4:1-11

- Did you notice how Jesus responded to Satan

- How much knowledge is needed to fight temptations?
