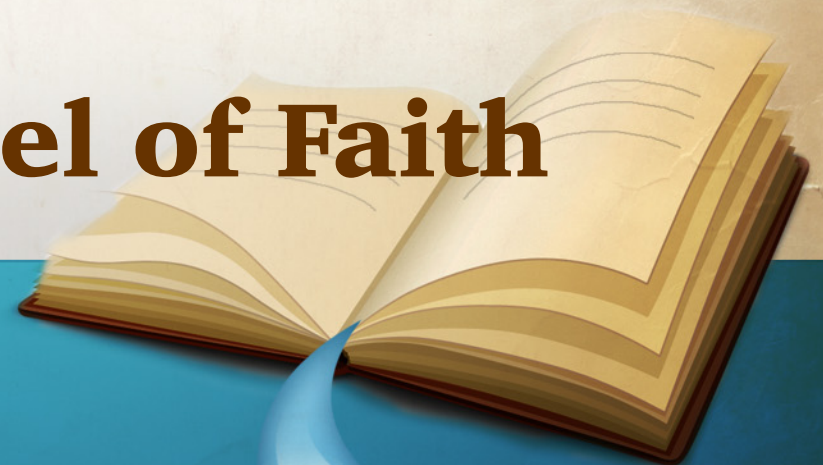

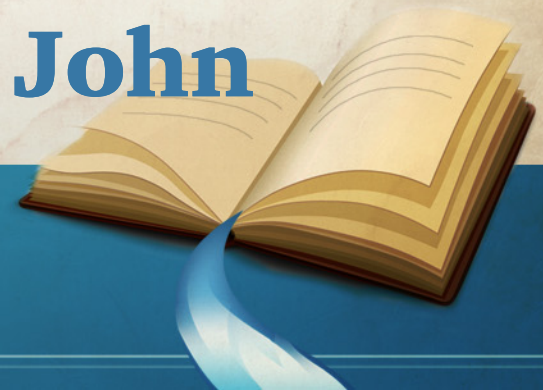

# The Rejection of the King – John 19.1-16

- **“Crucify him, crucify him” v. 4**
  - This was the extent of their rejection.
- **“He has made himself the son of God” v. 7**
  - This was the reason for their rejection.
- **“We have no king but Caesar” v. 15**
  - This was profession of their rejection.

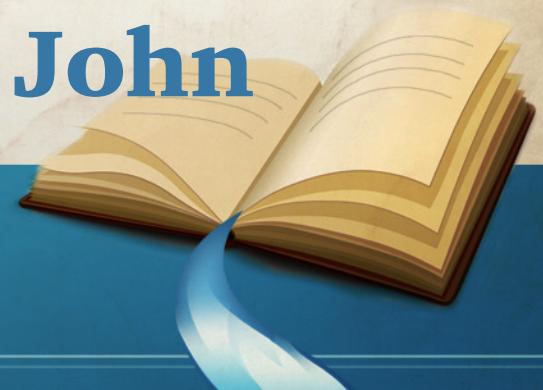

# The Crucifixion of the King – John 19.17-30

- **“he went out bearing his own cross” v. 17**
  - Jesus asked his followers to do the same.
- **“Behold, your mother” v. 27**
  - Jesus showed compassion even while hurting.
- **“It is finished” v. 30**
  - Jesus was committed to the Father’s purpose.

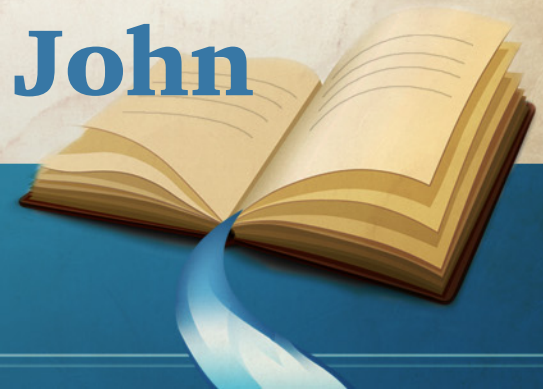

## – John 19.31-42

- **“his testimony is true” v. 35**
  - We can have confidence in what is written.
- **“that Scripture might be fulfilled” v. 36**
  - We can have confidence in God’s plan .
- **“so they took the body of Jesus” v. 40**
  - We can have confidence for redemption.

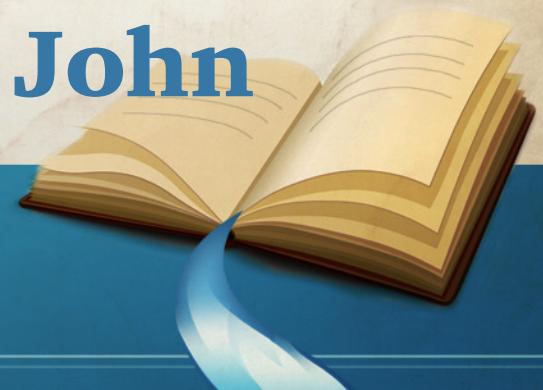
