## January 24, 2021 - Faith or Works?

In Romans 3:28, Paul writes, “For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from works of the Law.” He sets faith against works in this verse. However, in Romans 1:5 and 16:25 he says his goal is to bring about “the obedience of faith,” or “the works of faith.” So...are faith and works against each other, or do they work together?

It depends on the context. Faith and works are set against each other **only** in the context of the basis, or root cause, for our salvation. Our faith in Jesus’ sacrifice on the cross is the basis for our salvation, **not** our own good works. However, if we put our faith in Jesus, does He require works of obedience? Absolutely! In that context, works **go together** with our faith. As James puts it, “Faith without works is dead” (2:26) and when Abraham sacrificed Isaac, “faith was working with his works, and as a result of the works, faith was perfected.” (2:22)



You may be wondering, “But what if I don’t do all the right works or all the works right?” There’s no need to wonder; you won’t. I won’t. That’s why Jesus is the basis, or root cause, of our salvation! Our own works can never be that basis! This is the great news of the gospel! We can never do enough right things or enough things right to earn Heaven; we’ve already sinned and messed that up (Romans 3:23) and we’ll continue to mess up despite efforts to the contrary (1 John 1:10). We do good works because that’s our new purpose (Ephesians 2:10), but because we still sin and mess up, it’s our faith in the forgiveness of the cross that gets us to Heaven. Our faith in God’s mercy on the cross is the basis, or root cause, for our access to Heaven. Faith requires works, but praise be to God our works aren’t the basis for salvation!

**Consider this illustration.** Which is the basis, or root cause, for staying alive each day: our work of breathing or the fact that there’s air to breathe? It’s the fact that there’s air to breathe! Why? Because without air to breathe, our work of breathing wouldn’t do us any good! So in the context of the basis, or root cause, for life, air is the basis, not our work of breathing. We did nothing to earn or deserve or work for air at all. It’s a gift! However, in another context, like, “What do we need to do with air in order to live?” The answer is, “We’re required to breathe air in to live.” In that context, air and breathing work together to give us life!

Likewise, faith in Jesus is the basis for our salvation because without His sacrifice on the cross, our good works wouldn’t do us any good! We’re criminals sentenced to death for our sin and good works can’t reverse it. Jesus’ sacrifice is like the “air” of our spiritual life! Without it we die! We did nothing to earn or deserve or work for that sacrifice at all. It’s a gift! However, in another context, like, “What does Jesus require of us?” The answer is, “He requires us to obey Him to live.”

Someone might say, “Okay, but if salvation requires my works like living requires my breathing, it still sounds like it depends on me!” To some extent, it does! If we make a conscious decision not to breathe, we’ll die. Likewise, if we make a conscious decision to disobey Jesus, we’ll be lost. However, isn’t it true even when we’re trying to breathe, we don’t always breathe properly? Sometimes we have asthma, COPD, restrictions to the airway at night with sleep apnea, and many other breathing problems. But what’s still there? Air. The solution for breathing issues is to get us more air by hooking us up to oxygen or, in some cases, performing CPR. Our breathing is imperfect, just like our works are imperfect. Even when we try to do good works for Jesus, we don’t always do those works properly. But Jesus’ sacrifice, like air, is always there to resuscitate us when we fail.

Faith and works go together like air and breathing, but faith is the basis, or root cause, of our salvation. Not works.
