February 28, 2021 - Story: The Power to Defeat our Enemies



What was the most powerful weapon God gave the children of Israel when they entered the Promised Land? Conventional wisdom would look to things like swords, horses, chariots, brilliant military leaders, or a huge army. The most powerful weapon God gave them was the power of story. Stories have the power to discourage and eventually defeat our enemies.

After God killed the firstborn in every Egyptian house, they begged their slaves to leave. The Israelites obeyed God and asked the Egyptians for their household possessions. The grieving Egyptian families gladly weighed the Israelites down with gold and silver. God's people made their way to the Red Sea when they suddenly realized the Egyptian army was in hot pursuit. They felt trapped, and cried out to the Lord.

The Lord moved His angel to the back of the camp to stand between His people and His enemies. He also sent the pillar of fire and the pillar of cloud behind the Israelites. The pillar of fire gave light to the Israelites while the pillar of cloud assured that the Egyptians would be living in darkness.

Moses made the famous statement, "Do not be afraid. Stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord, which He will accomplish for you today. For the Egyptians whom you see today, you shall see again no more forever. The Lord will fight for you, and you shall hold your peace." He then stretched his staff over the Red Sea and the story becomes even more unbelievable. The Red Sea divided, leaving two walls of water and a dry path to safety. The Israelites hurried across on dry land. At the same time God looked down on the Egyptians and troubled their army. He took their chariot wheels off so "they drove them with difficulty." Many of the soldiers, still reeling from losing their firstborn, cried out, "Let us flee from the face of Israel, for the Lord fights for them against the Egyptians."

It was too late! Moses reached out over the Red Sea causing the water to engulf the mighty Egyptian army in their watery tomb. After they crossed the Red Sea and saw God wipe out the Egyptian army, they praised Him in song. The song included these words, "The people will hear and be afraid; Sorrow will take hold of the inhabitants of Philistia. Then the chiefs of Edom will be dismayed; The mighty men of Moab, Trembling will take hold of them; All the inhabitants of Canaan will melt away. Fear and dread will fall on them; By the greatness of Your arm They will be as still as a stone, Till Your people pass over, O Lord, Till the people pass over Whom You have purchased."

That's exactly what happened. After Joshua took over leadership from Moses, he sent two men to spy out the land. The two spies found themselves hiding out at Rahab's house. She told the spies that the people of Jericho had heard three stories of God's deliverance. They heard the stories of the Red Sea crossing, the victory over Sihon, and the victory over Og. These stories caused the Israelites' enemies to be filled with terror, become fainthearted, their hearts to melt, and their courage to evaporate.

After this encounter with Rahab, the children of Israel crossed the Jordan River. This story of the Jordan River crossing had a huge effect on God's enemies. Joshua 5:1 says, So it was, when all the kings of the Amorites who were on the west side of the Jordan, and all the kings of the Canaanites who were by the sea, heard that the Lord had dried up the waters of the Jordan from before the children of Israel until we had crossed over, that their heart melted; and there was no spirit in them any longer because of the children of Israel.

Wow! I know God could have defeated the Canaanites without the story, but He didn't. He chose to use the power of story to put fear in the hearts of His enemies and to give His people courage. Never underestimate the power of Bible stories to defeat our enemies and give us courage. - Dwayne Gandy
