

## Allergic To Sin?

All of this got me to thinking: "What if man were allergic to sin?" For example, every time you told a lie, your tongue would swell up. Every time you gave somebody a dirty look, your eye would water and swell. Every time you said some bad word, your lips would blow up like a balloon! Do you think people would learn to quit sinning? God made man a free moral agent. He gives him choices. Now that doesn't mean choices are without consequences. They are not. But God doesn't always punish immediately for our sins. He wants us to learn from them, repent of them, and stop doing them. But sometimes it takes us a long time to realize the vanity and emptiness that comes from a life of sin. The apostle Paul said, "But I discipline my body and bring it into subjection, lest, when I have preached to others, I myself should become disqualified" (1 Corinthians 9:27). Now in some cases, we are allergic to sin. Consider 1 Corinthians 6:18: "Flee sexual immorality.
