# Review

**As a narrative, the gospel can utilize good storytelling techniques that invite the reader to participate—**

**Movement – Journey of becoming/  
discovery**

**Tension – Obstacles we face/are**

**Characters – Recognize ourselves  
or aspire to imitate**

## Review

**Consistent themes hold the story together as a coherent whole and direct the reader to the author's/editor's intentions—**

**Holy Spirit – Drives the story**

**Prayer – Context of anticipation**

**Proclamation – Promises and fulfillment**

**People on the fringe – Poor, women, sick, sinners, Gentiles**

**They are ensnared by their greed and power.**

**The disciples' greatest danger is becoming like them.**
