

 - THIS IS THE PROPHETS' TEXT
 - PROSPERITY VS DESTRUCTION

 - LEND BUT NOT BORROW


DEUTERONOMY 28 - THE CURSES

- IN THE CITY AND FIELD
 - BASKET AND KNEADING BOWL
 - "FRUIT"
 - GOING OUT AND COMING IN
 - CONFUSION AND FRUSTRATION
 - PESTILENCE
 - DISEASE, DROUGHT, BLIGHT, AND MILDEW
 - SKIES OF BRONZE AND IRON
 - DEFEATED BY ENEMIES
 - BODIES LEFT TO BE EATEN
 - BOILS, TUMORS, SCABS, ITCH
