Mark 5:1-20

8. Did the demons believe in Jesus? If so, what response did this faith produce?
- Yes!
 - This belief resulted in fear and trembling (cf. James 2:19)

Mark 5:1-20

9. What was the response of the demon-possessed man after the demons were excised? How did the people in the area respond?
- The man asked to be with Jesus
 - The people asked Jesus to leave the area

1. How did the people of Nazareth react to Jesus' teachings?
 - Astonishment (Mk 6:2)
 - Offended (Mk 6:3)

2. Why could Jesus not do many works in Nazareth?
 - They did not believe (Mk 6:6)

Mark 6:7-13

3. What was the commission given to the twelve when Jesus sent them out?
 - Preach that people should repent (Mk 6:12)
 - “The kingdom of God is at hand” (Matt 10:7)
 - Signs and wonders were given to confirm their words (Mk 6:7)

Mark 6:14-29

4. What characteristics do we see in Herod that led to these events?
- Immoral
 - Rash decision making
 - Easily manipulated
 - Prideful
 - Superstitious

5. What moved Jesus to respond to the multitude in the way that He did and perform the feeding of the 5,000?
 - Compassion (Mk 6:34)

Mark 6:45-56

6. Why did Jesus separate Himself from His apostles? What application(s) can we take from this?
 - He went to pray to His Father (Mk 6:46)

Mark 6:45-56

7. How did the apostles respond to seeing Jesus walking on the water?
 - With fear
 - They thought they saw a ghost

8. What application should the apostles have taken from the feeding that would have helped them during this event?
- They did not understand the meaning of Jesus' power
 - They did not recognize Jesus as the Son of God
