Isaiah 14

5. What three things (Isaiah 14) happened as a result of the fall of Babylon?

- The restoration of Israel (verses 1-2)**
- A taunt song (verses 3-23)**
- The Lord's purpose is accomplished (verses 24-27)**

Isaiah 14

6. When was Israel restored to their own land? See 2 Chronicles 36:15-23

7. What are the four points to the taunt song found in chapter 14?

- (Verses 4-7) Kings power is broken**
- (Verses 8-11) The world rejoices at his fall**
- (Verses 12-20) He's humiliated and brought low**
- (Verses 20-23) His nation will be utterly destroyed**

What about Lucifer? Isaiah 14:12

KJV: “How you are fallen from heaven, O Lucifer, son of the morning.”

- The term “Lucifer” was taken by the KJV translators from Jerome’s Latin Vulgate (383-405 A.D.) edition of the Bible. The Hebrew word is “Heylel” which suggests the idea of “shining,” or “bearing light.”**

Jerome assumed the word was the name of the morning star, hence, he rendered it by the Latin title “Lucifer.”

What about Lucifer? Isaiah 14:12

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- An idea developed that Lucifer in Isaiah 14 and the details in this chapter were a depiction of what happened to the devil.**
- But what about the context? What might Lucifer teach us about Bible study?**

9. Moab was the descendants of Lot (Genesis 19:37).

- Moab was a narrow strip of land directly east of the Dead Sea. Its inhabitants were called Moabites and were neighbors to the Israelites. Moab, the father of the Moabites, was the son of Lot by firstborn daughter. Ruth, who is in the genealogy of King David was a Moabite.**
