A few minutes ago, NBC reported that Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg just passed away at the age of 87.* Given her age and her recent battles with three different forms of cancer, including pancreatic cancer, this was certainly not in the category of “shocking” news. I must say, though, that my eyebrows raised a tad upon hearing the reports of her final request. Whether this is exaggerated news or real news will remain to be seen, but for now the news is that before taking her last breath she dictated a note to a family member. The note read, “My most fervent wish is that I not be replaced until a new President is installed.”
